The 2019 budget was approved at the Annual Meeting in August. It included costs to contract for beach cleanup which has been challenging in recent years due to large logs that have washed up on our shore. In order to keep up with expenses, the maintenance fee was increased to \$255 per home. Unimproved lots remain at \$10. FUNDS INVESTED

Funds for the road, often referred to as the Logan fund, have been invested in CDs: \$50,000 in an 18 month CD and \$64,443.59 in a 48 month CD. Both are with the Aberdeen Proving Ground Credit Union, which had the best rates available.
