The directory is **PASSWORD PROTECTED AND IS FOR WVS PROPERTY OWNERS ONLY**. Please do not share the password as we do not want the information to be available to solicitors and advertisers. The password will be changed annually and will be provided in the maintenance fee invoices.

To access the directory, go to the West View Shores website (www.westviewshores.org) and click on Home. Drop down to the Directory. Enter the password and click on Enter. The password is case sensitive. There are two listings: alphabetically and by street address. The directory can be downloaded if you want to have a paper copy. Please see your maintenance fee invoice for the current password.

DREDGING
