# **Road Repairs & Construction Notes:**

As a reminder, please remember to trim up your low hanging trees so as to not damage boats, delivery trucks, or even vehicles as they drive by.

#### Guest Policy for Beach, Boat Ramp & Pier:

As we approach summer, please be mindful of the guest policy for the beach, boat ramp, and pier. The WVS waterfront facilities are for the use of the residents and their guests ONLY. What does it mean to be a "guest"? A "guest" is defined as someone currently visiting a resident or is accompanied by a resident. It does not extend to outsiders who were "granted permission by a resident" to use our facilities. These individuals should be directed to other facilities such as Stemmer's Run boat ramp. All cars, golf carts, and trailers using the WVS facilities should



have a sticker on them. Dave Lee has more stickers in case anyone needs one. Remember that Bay View residents are NOT permitted to use the beach or boat ramp at West View Shores.
